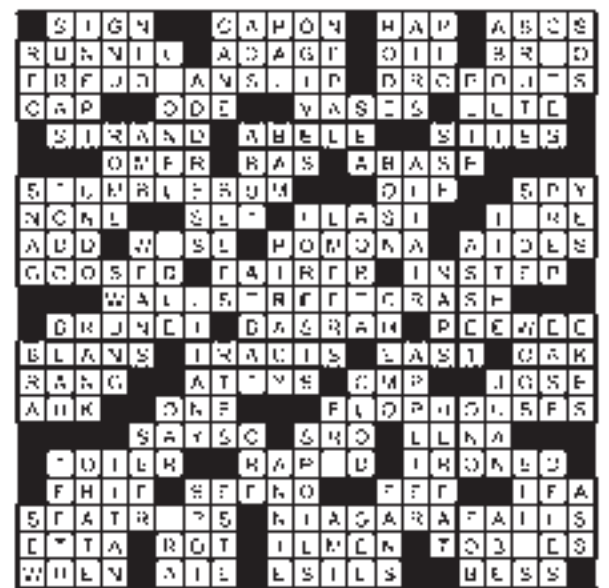
Jan. 6 Just Acting Stupid
